Have you ever wondered what it means if your child has a speech and language disorder or delay?

There are different types of disorders and delays, and your child's school or early intervention speech and language pathologist (SLP) can help. Read this interesting article that breaks down the types of speech and language disorder your child can have as well as all the services that can be provided by the speechlanguage pathologist. You'd be surprised by all the services a SLP can provide to help you and your child.

Should you have concerns with your child's speech and language development, you should also seek the advice of a professional. Children ages birth to three in the state of PA can be evaluated and receive services free of charge through their local early intervention programs. Families should call 1-800-CONNECT for more information on how to access early intervention services. If your child is of school age, contact the school and ask to have your child evaluated. If your child qualifies for services, the school will offer your child an IEP and will provide the services needed.
